

# Indianapolis students join in fight to save Crown Hill trees

INDIANAPOLIS (WTHR) - Students from the School for Community Learning are getting a lesson in civics.

The second and third graders are teaming up with the **Indiana Forest Alliance** to save several 300-year-old trees at Crown Hill Cemetery.

The Department of Veterans Affairs, which bought the land last year, plans to build a large monument. It will ultimately hold the ashes of 25,000 Hoosier veterans.

But the plan means some of the trees will be cut down.

The students are planning a walk for Sunday to also bring awareness to the issue.

The Department of Veterans Affairs tells us it will save as many of the trees as they can, but they are moving forward with plans for the memorial.
